COMMUNION ARRANGEMENTS FOR COELIACS AND THOSE WITH GLUTEN INTOLERANCE

From this weekend onward, we will have a chalice available at communion time for coeliac and those with a gluten intolerance. This will be a separate chalice, reserved for those with gluten intolerance/allergy, so that cross-contamination cannot occur. The chalice will be placed on a table at the top of the church, close to the celebrant. If you are coeliac, you are invited to come forward and receive from this chalice.
