The Brent's are back



As we go to print, our local Brent geese have just returned to their normal grazing grounds at Ard Scoil Ris. We are part of their annual migration south to escape the harsh Arctic winter from their breeding grounds around Baffin Bay in Canada.

Like all other species their arrival is now predicated on how global warming affects their habitat.

Dublin Bay has always been an important stopping off place for them with its many green areas, not only those of the North Bull but every pitch and park around the Clontarf and Malahide area. Of course, we are only one of the many areas they return to each year, moving south as they do from Strangford Lough, usually one of their first ports of call. It seems that the bay area is like many northerly fiords and that they see the ground pattern as reminding them of their northerly way points. While there are some colonies already at the Bull island our regulars have just arrived.

They occupy the green spaces around us and are not easily disturbed, while as we see them grazing at Ard Scoil Ris they rarely take flight. It is almost as if they have become domesticated to our environment.

For those of us who love to see them coming, they tend to mark our year, and are an important part of our seasonal story, bringing the first news of impending winter and on their departure as harbingers of summers to come, as the poet says, "the change that brings the swallow and the geese in turn".

PAT ON TAP



Hi everyone, Pat here again Wishing you all a very Happy Christmas. Where did the year go? Hope you all enjoyed our lovely summer .Where did you go for your Holidays? We have been spending a few weeks for the last 3 years dog and hen minding in my son and daughter in laws place in Dunboyne which I call Green Acres after the TV series; anyone remember it? When we arrived we received our instructions regarding feeding dogs and hens and releasing hens in morning feeding them and collecting eggs plus tucking them in at night. Learned on arriving that one of the hens had died, so there were now 4 to be looked after. Thank God it did not happen during our watch.

The hen coop is in the centre of the horse walker. A horse walker is something that you hook your horse up to it if you want to cool your horse down after a lesson, show etc. This particular horse walker consist of a central walled in area accessed by a gate and the hen house is in this central area there is also a narrower walled in outer area where the horses are walked which also has a gate when I get the hens in I close both gates to keep them safe from foxes or other predators who may be roaming at night. The first evening I had quite a job trying to chase them in but eventually got them all tucked in. I discovered after that the hens would follow me like I was the Pied Piper of Hamelin if I slowly walked towards the walker and had a handful of feed for them.

After tucking the hens away the first night I was early the next morning to release the captives. I was greeted at the gate to the field where the horse walker was by a hen, I didn't know if it was the hen who was buried in the bin who had resurrected, and I should call her Lazarus, or had I got it wrong and I had a family of 5 hens to mind not 4 and should call her Plus one, or had she escaped from the double walled horse walker and should I call her Houdini. Anyhow, I went and released the hens of which there were only 3. When I related my tale to my daughter in law Niamh, I was told that this was a regular performance from this hen and they called her Lucky because although she insisted on being in the open she had not been captured by the fox.

The next morning I was greeted by Houdini/Lucky again and another hen in the outer circle who I immediately named The Apprentice. I only got one egg every morning with the exception on one morning when there were two I thought it was my birthday or maybe the hens did anyhow, obviously they were laying out but never discovered where.

I am not one that ever remembers dreaming but I did have a dream that I was lying down on the reclining chair and couldn't move. Lucky was perched on my shoulder and biting my ear off from top to bottom it was real scary and I haven't looked at Lucky without thinking about it since. To overcome my new fear of hens I decided to paint a picture of Lucky. I don't know if my

therapy worked as I haven't been in the company of hens since I painted the picture. The painting of "Lucky" is as usual in Acrylic on board. If you have a holiday story, please let us hear from you. We had a few new members at the indoor bowls following my last article. If anyone is still thinking of joining why not drop down to St Anthony's for a 3week free trial. Simply Cooking

CHRISTMAS CAKE

Ingredients:

700/1½ lbs. Mixed Fruit

100g./3½oz. almonds, blanched and chopped

70g/21/2 oz. ground almonds

Grated zest of 1 lemon

5 large eggs, free range

170 g/6oz. glacé cherries (wash, dry, cut in half)

200 g/7oz. butter (room temp.)

230g/8oz. brown sugar 260g/9oz. plain flour

7.5ml./1½ tsp. nutmeg Grated zest of 1 orange

2.5ml./½ a tsp mixed spice

45ml./3 tbsp whiskey 115g/4oz. mixed peel

Method:

Place the fruit and the whiskey in a bowl, stir well, cover with cling film and leave to soak overnight.

Prepare a 23cm./ 9in. round cake tin (for a deeper cake use a 20cms/8in. tin). Line the inside of the tin with a double thickness of baking parchment and the outside with a double layer of brown paper.

Pre-heat the oven to 140C/275F/Gas Mark 1.

Sieve the dry ingredients into a large bowl.

Beat the sugar and butter together. Mix in the beaten eggs, fruit, and flour, until well combined. Stir in the lemon and orange rind.

Place the mixture in the prepared tin and smooth the top with a wet, metal spoon.

Bake in pre-heated oven for approx. 3½hrs. Bottom shelf.

Test, remove from the oven. Place on a wired rack and leave to cool in the tin.

Wrap in a double layer of parchment and tin foil. Store in a cool dry place.

Almond paste ingredients

340g/12oz. ground almonds

170g/6 oz. castor sugar

170g/6 oz. icing sugar, sieved

7.5ml./1½ tsp. lemon juice

1 egg, size 3

5ml/ 1 tsp almond essence

Method:

Mix together

Royal icing ingredients

680 g/ 1½lbs of instant icing sugar.


