## Love trusts, it sets free,

Now that the Lenten season is upon us it is time to reflect a little on the message contained on the Parish Christmas card. The card, in this year of the Family, reminded us of Pope Francis' recurring theme, expressed more fully in his recent encyclical.

The card reminds us that Christmas is a sign of God's love for us in the birth of the Infant. Our Lenten preparation reminds us of the culmination of that love when Christ went to His death for our sakes.

This is the ultimate expression of God's love.

And Pope Francis reminds us of the imperfect view we have of God in our world.

We have lived and continue to live in our Christian world with the Ten Commandments as our guide.

We know that Christ did not come to rewrite those commandments but show how God wished us to live them. He has told us that there are two great commandments, namely 'To love God', and to 'Love our neighbour'.

Pope Francis continues to remind us that our religion is about those two commandments; that all else must be filtered through the net of loving God and loving His reflection in our neighbour.

He continues to remind us that because we were bound so closely to the Old testament view of the Commandments that we forgot what Christ came on earth for. Remember, he came to save sinners. Peter, was the first to acknowledge Christ, and to accept that He had the message of eternal life.

When Peter was given the authority to act on behalf of Christ he knew that he was bound by that message which Christ had given the Apostles. He became a light unto the gentiles and to the unbeliever, not to bind them in the chains of the Old Testament but to encourage them to live in the new world, where God's love would be manifest.

So many errors of the past were caused, by how people understood, or misunderstood the Commandments, rather than by the message of Christ. We have always tended to forget the Second Commandment which reminds us not to take God's name in vain. What had more vanity than to speak for Him while ignoring the Gospel message.

Pope Francis continues to remind us that love, human love is imperfect, our love for God is imperfect and our understanding of how we follow in His path is sometimes caught up in the arrogance of being right.

Judgment and righteousness are God's domain where we tread at our peril. Life and history should teach the message that the Pope wishes us to hear. As the encyclical reminds us 'the Church is not a tollhouse; it is the house of the Father, where there is a place for everyone, with all their problems'.

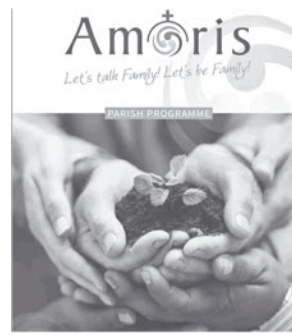


### A scripture based contemplative prayer group

## THE WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES



In preparation for this great event, Pope Francis has tasked the Irish Church with spreading the good news of family and the role which the family has in preserving not only the stability of society but in actively maintaining God's presence amongst us.

To this end and taking his most engaging and insightful

encyclical, *Amoris Laetitia*, as a template, he has posed for us the question, "Does the Family continue to be good news for today's world? Pope Francis firmly believes this, and he believes passionately in the need to support the family since the family is part of God's plan.

As part of the programme the organisers have taken on board Pope Francis' desire that the faithful, through coming to understand the role of family in our Christian life, will become familiar with his encyclical "The Joy of Love".

The *Amoris* programme is the response to this request, and the programme over the coming months will help and support families in every parish to prepare for this great celebration of family.

The programme is available on line and it is hope that parishes will put on the programme over six parts which will concentrate on The Joy of Love.

Using engaging short videos, animations and activities to encourage discussion, it will offer families, parishes and wider society an opportunity to think about our vision and hopes for family and marriage, and a chance to rediscover the gift that family is to the world.

The programme will also challenge us to reflect on how we can provide greater support for marriage and family in our local communities. Pope Francis has asked us to think about support for newly married couples and outreach to families in need.

The programme also encourages families and parish groups to organise events either in their home or in a parish setting which will bring together families and parishioners in a spirit of the wider family of God in each parish.

Resources are also being made available to schools and material which can be used by families for their children.

The organisers will also have an online and media presence over the next six months to spread the good news more widely and to make it available to all.

## PAT ON TAP

You might find it strange with Christmas gone and starting the New Year to be faced with a picture of our Crib and reading an article about it, but we need Jesus imprinted in our hearts to face the challenges of the New Year. The Crib is a good visual aid to help us get in touch with the scripture story of the birth of our Saviour. St Francis of Assisi was responsible for the concept of the first crib in 1223.

It's not too late for a New Year resolution to get in touch with Jesus; a good way to do is recommended by Pope Francis, the Lectio Divina. We are fortunate to have two groups in this parish you could consider joining either the Thursday morning group at 11am in the Annadale Room, or the Scripture based Contemplative Prayer Group in the Oratory of Clonturk House on a Tuesday evening at 8pm. Do please give some thought to joining one of these or a similar group this year.

The love of my life, Miriam, was approached by our local PP, Fr Tom in late November 2017 to know if I could touch up a few statues for the crib. They had got a bit chipped during recent electrical work in the church. When I had a look at them I was surprised at the Parish Priests use of the English language. In the case of the donkey, half the head and one and a half ears were missing; the cow was missing both horns and one of the wise men had lost the top off his nose, his bottom lip, part of his beard and a piece out of his shoe. One of the Shepherds, who was holding a sheep had part of his ear missing, apart from which the rest were chipped.

Anyway, I decided to give it a go even though the parts that were broken off had gone missing. You can see the results of my efforts with the picture I share here of our Crib.

I must say that it was a challenge and a privilege that I enjoyed. Initially I had intended to just paint over the broken parts and they could be hidden away at the back of the crib. Then I remembered the sculpture classes I had done as part of my art course in Colaiste Dhulaigh, and decided to try to reconstruct the missing pieces. I was pleased with the visual result but they are not very secure but with careful handling should last for years. It was a special challenge to try to match up the colours to the original and I prayed to the Holy Spirit for guidance. I couldn't believe how quickly he answered my prayer. When I patched up the chipped and restored parts it still did not look right; faded, old and stained paint did not go well with the new even, when it was the same exact colour, so I had to repaint them all. The arm of the Infant Jesus started to crumble away and I found it was not as solid as the other pieces. When I saw how vulnerable the infant was it recalled what a great feast Christmas is that Jesus came to us as a vulnerable infant to save us. Thank you, Jesus.

The infant has a halo which none of the other pieces have so I can't help but wonder if it is not an original piece from the crib. You will also notice there is no angel in our crib. Luckily enough for me or I could be still there painting. Was there an angel originally in the crib and if so what happened to it? There was a name and date on the base of the statue of The Blessed Virgin "A Dadre, BOW 1923" does anyone know anything about this? It would be lovely to know the history of our crib which looks like has been in our parish from the beginning; was it donated by some a firm or individual? Was there a special collection to raise the money to purchase it? If you know anything about the crib or where it originated from please get in touch. So this time I leave you with a lot of questions. God bless for now

# Simply Cooking

## STUFFED PORK STEAK

### Ingredients:

1 ¼ lbs. (800g) pork steak. (round steak can be used instead)

**Stuffing:** 3 cupfuls bread crumbs

1 medium onion, chopped

1 tsp parsley, finely chopped

1 tsp dried mixed herbs

1 oz (28g) butter - milk to bind.

### Method:

Wipe pork steak with clean cloth. Make a cut through steak with sharp knife. Put the stuffing right along the steak, turn over and tie securely with string.

Place in roasting tin with some cooking oil and cover with tin foil.

Preheat oven to Gas Mark 4, Electric 350°F (180°C).

Cook for 90 minutes approximately on middle shelf. Remove tin foil for last 20 minutes.

**Serve with roast potatoes, carrots, broccoli or turnip.**

## WHISKEY BREAD & BUTTER PUDDING:

### Ingredients

75g / 3 oz Butter (softened)

300 ml / ½ pint Cream

1 Small Sliced Pan

300 ml / ½ pint Milk

110g/4 oz Sultanas

5 Eggs

Measure of Irish Whiskey

110g/4 oz Caster Sugar

### Method:

Soak sultanas in whiskey overnight.

Butter a medium size oven-proof dish.

Remove crusts from bread and butter both sides. Then cut each slice into quarters. Arrange single layer of bread triangles in bottom of buttered dish. Scatter some of soaked sultanas over the top and place another layer of bread triangles over these.

Sprinkle remaining sultanas on top.

Press down gently with Spatula.

### To make Custard:

Heat milk and cream in pan until it almost comes to boil.

Remove from heat. Whisk eggs and sugar in large bowl until pale in colour. Pour boiled liquid onto egg mixture and mix well until frothy. Allow custard to stand for a few minutes.

Pour two thirds of custard over layered bread triangles and leave to stand for 30 mins until bread has soaked up the custard.

Pre-heat oven to 180°C/350°F Gas Mark 4. Pour remaining custard over soaked bread and butter triangles.

Press down firmly with the spatula.

Bake for 30/35 mins until top is golden brown. Serve with Cream or Ice Cream.

## POPE FRANCIS ON SILENCE AT MASS

People should pray silently before Mass, preparing "to meet with Jesus" instead of engaging in "chitchat". "Silence is so important. Remember we are not going to a show. Silence prepares us and accompanies us".

The Eucharist is "the highest, the most sublime and, at the same time, the most concrete" way of encountering God's love.

"This is the greatest grace: to experience that the Eucharist is the privileged moment to be with Jesus and, through him, with God and with our brothers and sisters."

Allow oneself to be "surprised by the living encounter with the Lord" and don't simply "talk to God like a parrot," repeating the words of prayers without thinking.

"The encounter with God is a living encounter. It is not an encounter of a museum, it is a living encounter. And we go to Mass, not a museum! We go to a living encounter with the Lord."

Here we discover that God's greatest surprise is that He "loves us even in our weakness. The Lord encounters our frailty. This is the environment of the Eucharist. This is prayer."

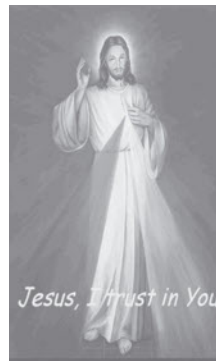

## HIDDEN GEMS

Now that our Church has been fully restored and is beautifully bright, one notices that our high windows are designed to capture light and highlight the beautiful plasterwork of the ceiling and the surrounding capitals.

However, each of our small side altars conceals hidden gems, hidden behind the statue of the Sacred Heart on the left and St. Joseph on the right. Here we have a brilliant example of the art of mosaic, one of the oldest forms of Church decoration, and a skill dating from early Greek and Roman civilisation.



Each altar has beautiful scenes from the life of Christ and the Holy family. Who the artist was, we do not know but using the great skill which he possessed, each mosaic is full of vibrant colour and reflects the light beautifully. Each small tile, from either marble or other coloured stone is set in such a way that they catch the light giving a lift to the whole wall and the little altar.

We know that people like to have statues to venerate, but it seems a pity that these beautiful scenes are not clearly visible to everyone, since they too encourage reflection and prayer.

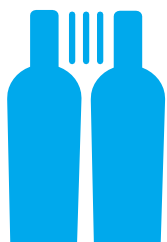
