We should also feel that joy as summer approaches, with the Pope's visit on the horizon and the great feelings that that invokes.

In the last beautiful, hopeful lines, we are told that goodness and mercy will follow us all the days of our lives. This great commitment from God tells us that His goodness and mercy are there for us all the time but most especially at the last.

And as we pass through Mary's month, Ascension Day has come and gone. With the Feast of Pentecost, we have two great reminders that Christ has gone before us, but He has not left us orphans. He has sent the Holy Spirit to us, to give us courage in faith, all the while following us with the 'goodness and mercy' promised to us by God.

LOCAL PHARMACY TEAMS UP WITH YOUNG IRISH ENTREPRENEUR TO TRIAL NEW WATER TESTING KIT.

If anyone has photos of it please email them on to us at the Newsletter as I can't put my hand on any of it. The Old bandstand unfortunately had to go during the construction of the tunnel.

At the moment our Church is unfortunately like the old bandstand with the ground going from under it. We cannot continue as we are because if we do the Church will disappear in a few short years. There was an article in our last issue titled "The Way Forward" which was by Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger later to be Pope Benedict. In it he stated that the future of the church will be reshaped by the saints. I believe the time has come for us to reshape the church.

The then Cardinal Ratzinger said that the church will become smaller and will have to start more or less from the beginning. I do not believe that we must necessarily become any smaller than we have I think the time has come to call a halt and reshape the church. Reshaping the Church is going to be a hard slog which will naturally upset a lot of people. We do not like change or to be shaken out of our comfort zone. It is possible and even likely that in the process of change we will lose more of our members but this should not stop us from moving forward. We are not meant to be a stagnant Church keeping our heads down afraid to upset people. We were commissioned to go out two by two and evangelise the world.

One of the ways of moving forward as a parish that we should consider is Irish Paris Cell Groups. People come to a more personal relationship with Jesus through joining and taking part in a cell group. They come to know Jesus instead of just knowing about him. The aims of a cell group are to grow in intimacy with the Lord, to grow to love one another, and to share Jesus with others. There are two models of Church regeneration which are worth considering one from Canada the other from the USA. Luckily both of these are laid out in book form. The Canadian model can be studied in "Divine Renovation" by Fr. James Mallon. The second "Rebuilt" by Fr. Michael White and tom Corcoran is worth serious consideration.

I would like to recommend to the priests of the parish and the Parish Council that they study at least one of these books with a view to moving the parish to a period of new growth. We as parishioners should also purchase copies with a view to studying how we can help our parish move forward from the present difficult times. I believe "Rebuilt" is available through Footprints. We cannot continue as we are and expect things to change for the better we have to do something to make things change. That's all until the next time.

CHEDDAR BEEF PIE

800g Potatoes

90g Butter, chilled

1 onion, chopped

200g Mushrooms, sliced

600 gm Beef mince

1 x 400g tin chopped tomatoes

240ml. beef stock

Salt and black pepper

120ml. milk

A large handful of fresh chives, chopped

220g Cheddar, grated

METHOD

Bring a large saucepan of water with the potatoes to the boil and cook for 15 - 20 minutes until the potatoes are tender.

Preheat the oven to 190?C, Gas mark 5 and lightly grease a baking dish. Heat 30 gm of the butter in a large frying pan over a medium heat and cook the onion for 2 - 3 minutes, until softened but not browned. Add the mushrooms and cook for a further 5 minutes.

Stir in the beef mince and cook for five minutes. Stir in the tomatoes and beef stock and season with salt and pepper. Lower the heat and cook, stirring occasionally, for 10 - 15 minutes until most of the liquid has cooked off. Pour into the prepared baking dish and spread evenly.

Mash the potatoes with the remaining butter and milk and season with salt and pepper. Stir through the chives and Cheddar until it has melted. Spread over the meat filling and

bake for 20 - 25 minutes until the potatoes are browned and the filling is heated through.

Place in ovenproof dish Cover with foil and cook for 20 mins.

Meanwhile, assemble all the batter ingredients and beat well.

Remove rhubarb from oven, take off foil & pour batter mixture over

Sprinkle a few more spoonfuls of sugar over Return to oven and cook for about 25 mins. until golden & puffy.

and strong hand of John, his father.

The words from scripture come to mind, "I have carved you on the palm of my hand", describing God's wonderful creative act in each of our lives.

John and his wife brought this beautiful, previous and unique being into life. At birth they touched him, cradled him, loved him, embraced him and delighted in him.

HE BELONGED.

Saoirse John died a half hour after this photo was taken. He was only 22 weeks old.

He left a void because he had been conceived in love, he had lived and was loved.

Let's always protect life, from the womb to the tomb.

THERE IS ALWAYS TIME

Some time, after the crucifixion of Jesus, Pontius Pilate was informed by Rome that in crucifying Jesus, he had killed an innocent man. 

ST ANTHONY OF PADUA AND THE MULE (A EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE.)



There was a man in Rimini, Italy, a Jew, who refused to believe the doctrine of the Real Presence in the Eucharist. He challenged St Anthony saying that if his mule believed, he would, and said that he would starve his mule for three days and on the third day would have a bucket of oats in the town square. He required St Anthony to bring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to the square on the third day, and if the mule would come to Jesus in the monstrance rather than to the bucket of oats, he would believe.

On the third day the man came into the square with his hungry mule and St Anthony approached from the other side of the square, with the Sacred Host. Many people, believers and non believers, were gathered to watch the spectacle. A large bucket of oats and fragrant hay were placed before the hungry animal, but the mule ignored them. Instead, the mule approached the Saint and fell on her knees before the Blessed Sacrament. The man converted.
