Now that Autumn is upon us it is time to look at the fruits of the harvest. For we who believe, there are people who say that the Church is in its Autumn and heading for dark Winter.

Yes, Autumn is a time of reflection, a time when things seem to come to an end. We have had the celebrations and the joy of the Pope's visitation, even though the

various controversies seemed destined to sour the nature of his visit.

But perhaps if the Church is autumnal, the Pope's harvest is like picking blackberries. It is not possible to gather fruit without brambles and scratches along the way. Indeed, our sleeves can be torn in rough hedgerows. All of this will be worth it if we understand that Christ is with us, not Christ turning a blind eye to scandal but Christ who gave us the two great commandments, **Love God, and love your neighbour**. It is the Christ who will help Pope Francis work through this darkness, because Christ has also said: "I will be with you always even until the end of time".

Pope Francis is always a man of hope. He can make mistakes, being human as we saw. Yet people who have been close to him sense an inner peace, and a resolution to do what is right. He has said "no matter where God has planted you, hope. Always hope". This what he himself believes.

Such words are fitting at this season, when the leaves fall gently to earth, settling, laying a tender cushion which will nourish and protect over the dark winter days. This is also a time of memories - we remember those who are gone when we complete the List of the Dead, or with our observances of little sacrifices for the month of the Holy Souls. It is fitting to remember and pray for those we loved, those who were good to us and who contributed so much to our lives and to others.

Perhaps it is also a time to remember those who have no one, the lost ones, known only to God.

May his words, and those words of prayer with which we remember our loved ones at this time, nourish us now and in these times of darkness, so that we can carry on that faith in goodness which they have left to us.

Albert Camus, the writer has written "Autumn is a second spring when every leaf is a flower."

With God's help and our prayers may this Autumn bring forth a new Spring for all the faithful.





It is a painting of the view of Mountjoy prison that I had from my room in the Mater Hospital from the 6th floor. It was one of the nice things about my stay that I had a fantastic view of the north side and was able to pick out Marino Church.

Speaking of views from on high have you ever felt that the Holy Father views us from on high from his Vatican Balcony?

Well he came and walked among us unfortunately only for a few days. The Holy Fathers visit to us is over unfortunately as I said in the last issue I was not able to go to any of the events of "The World Meeting of Families". Fortunately, his visit was well covered by RTE and I must compliment them on a job well done.

Pope Francis said that "the world needs a revolution, a revolution of love." I sat back and enjoyed viewing his trip watching him visit Sean MacDermott Street, which the last Papal visit was expected to cover and didn't for some reason or another. Something, which I could never figure out. However, watching Pope Francis meeting the ordinary people of Dublin, I just got emotional and tears started to flow it moved me so much. I had the same experience watching him visit Brother Kevin, his helpers and their clients. I certainly was not expecting to be so moved by his visit.

What about the young girl getting a selfie at Croke Park; wasn't she very brave. The concert itself was most enjoyable to watch. I would love to know how the Holy Father has such energy it would be good to know his secret. On Sunday the 26th August 2018 the Holy Father visited our church. I know it was through the technology of TV, but it was wonderful to be there with so many of my fellow parishioners. We had a bird's eye view of the Holy Mass on an extremely large TV screen and fortunately the Church sound system was not used for this, so we could hear every word. It was like being there and being able to receive Holy Communion at the same time as those in the park was an extra bonus. Well done to all those responsible.

There was of course a lot of controversy with the visit but all that is covered elsewhere by our media so I won't go into that. I just want to say I believe actions must be taken and be seen to have been taken. Some of those who have been hurt by the Church will not unfortunately receive healing even if everything they ask is done, the wounds are so deep, but this should not stop the Church from taking appropriate action.

I would love to see reports from our parishioners in our Newsletter about their experiences of the Papal visit so please let's hear your story.

One of the ways we can do something that makes a difference is supporting the work of Fr William Stuart. Fr William Stuart is one of our own Rosminian Priests, who spoke at all the Masses in our Parish Church on Sunday 2nd September.He is spending the next 3 years working full time with the most vulnerable of refugees in Tyre, South Lebanon. Hallowe'en

However, it is a time of year when many of our older parishioners may be disturbed by the constant banging of fireworks, and by smoke from bonfires and even the risk of fire from sparks etc.

Let us commemorate Hallowe'en both in the Christian sense, while allowing the children their games, and helping the Holly party or trick or treating, or dressing up. Let's do the party bit with much respect for our neighbours and for our animals and for the environment. Let us not damage our green spaces by the debris of bonfires or upset pets by the constant noise. Let us celebrate as Christians caring for each other.

2 tbsp balsamic vinegar

100ml white wine

Salt and pepper

Put all the ingredients in a bowl, toss them together and season well. Put into a roasting tin and bake for 40 minutes. Serve with boiled/steamed baby potatoes or noodles.

EDUCATION FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES



Many of us will remember Fr. Stuart from his time in St. Josephs on Gracepark Road, now the Childvision Centre and celebrating mass in the Church there. Speaking at all Masses in our Parish Church, on Sunday 2nd September last, he outlined how he would be spending the next 3 years working full time with the most vulnerable of refugees in Tyre, South Lebanon. He reminded us that there are 2.5 million refugees in the Lebanon, which has its own population of just over 4 million people.

This is a huge burden on such a small country. Fr. Stuart has started a school in Tyre for the children. He hopes that the very young will be educated, and that the older ones including many adults will have sufficient education to take their place in whatever country they find themselves in in the future.

Archbishop Reflects On Papal Visit.

In a homily on the Sunday after Pope Francis visit, Archbishop Diarmuid Martin thanked all who had helped make the visit possible. He was especially delighted that the Pope had visited Lourdes parish and the Capuchin Centre. He reminded his listeners that he had posed the question as to what legacy would follow from the visit. He hoped that we would be encouraged to be more authentically the "Church of Jesus Christ in a culture that is different." After the visit he felt that the Church in Ireland must take responsibility for the future. The future remains the responsibility of the entire Church community. This is not to have an Irish Church but to find our way, not through division or agendas but to seek God's vision for us in our community of faith. We must not blind ourselves to the reality of the Gospel message, nor respond absent-mindedly to current trends

He said that one challenge facing the Church in Ireland in the years to come, is that of discerning where the essentials of the Christian life lie and how our institutions, in their daily life, witness to what is essential.

He felt that some people believe that going back to the norms of the past and those formerly strong traditions would protect us in a much more complex world. Others believe that not only freeing oneself from these practices but making radical changes would ensure our future.

He reminded us that Jesus challenges each of these positions and asks us to pursue" what is right and just and true and loving, and that this is not just an external ritual nor is it just the fruit of our own feeling of goodness, much less the fruits of a public opinion survey".

He reminded us that the pursuit of progress does not always bring happiness.

He also hoped that every parish in the Archdiocese would come together around the Feast day of St. Laurence O'Toole on 14th November to reflect on this challenge. This would not be about finding answers but finding a pathway forward for the Church in the years to come.

His concern was that we had to explain Jesus and His message so that He becomes central to the ongoing lives of our young people and that through this all of us can regain our sense of God within us.

He lamented the harshness of institutions and regimes in the past which was a betrayal of the Christian message. For us to be really renewed we must become the "community that witnesses to the love of Jesus Christ especially to the poorest and most vulnerable". "Only in this way will the Church in Ireland be authentically Church in a changing Ireland".
