Nelson Mandela has written, "Deep down in every human heart, there is mercy and generosity", and in that generosity, hope is the gift that is given.

#### National Geographic Magazine Nov 8th 2015,

On the front cover of the National Geographic magazine is a photograph of Our Lady and the legend "How the Virgin Mary became the most powerful woman in the world."

This a secular magazine with a worldwide distribution. A journalist with the magazine, Maureen Orth, undertook a study of Our Lady and her apparitions throughout the world. She came to the conclusion that "since Mary pleaded with Jesus at the wedding feast of Cana where he turned the water into wine, she has become a universal symbol of maternal love, as well as suffering and of sacrifice, Mary is often a touchstone of our longing for meaning, a more accessible link to the supernatural than formal Church teachings."

She has appeared in many countries throughout the centuries, including Ireland, consoling and comforting people with her spiritual encouragement, miracles and pleadings to return to the fervent practise of our faith and speaking of chastisement being visited upon us if we don't. In that context, Fr Regis Scanlon's article on the internet "Fatima, a sign of the times needs a closer look." Is well worth a read. She also asks people to say the Rosary which Padre Pio declares to be "the weapon against Satan." 200 million people are estimated to have visited Lourdes, since 1860, with seven thousand miracles claimed and sixty-nine of those officially recognised.

In Minya, Egypt, Muslims and Christians together, light candles to commemorate the Holy Family's biblical flight to Egypt. Each year, it also draws 2 million people to a Marian festival celebrated there. A record number of people have visited Knock Shrine this year. It has had its share of miracles also. The Polish Cardinal Padjic who is investigating the authenticity of Medjugorje has called it "Europe's largest confessional box," and "the Spiritual Lungs of Europe." The number of priestly and religious vocations inspired by people visiting Medjugorje is inspiring.

In 1920, in honour of Our Lady, Frank Duff founded the Legion of Mary, in Francis St, Dublin 8. Despite many difficulties, inspired by his faith, humility, and charisma, it grew to encompass all of Ireland, with Praesidia sprouting up, North and South of the border, before spreading to Europe and then worldwide. To this day, inspired by a love of Our Lady, it is still thriving. A lot of people who have survived financial, builders, government and Church collapses and could be classified as the walking wounded, at this stage, might consider as voluntary activity, joining their local branch of the Legion and helping out those less fortunate than themselves. #### FAIRVIEW MARINO MEN'S SHED.

The Fairview Marino Men's Shed meets every Wednesday at 11am till 1pm in St Vincent's GAA club. The Shed was established in January 2018 and has been developing since then. New members are always welcome to come along and see what the shed is about and have a chat and a cup of coffee.

The concept of the Men's Shed comes from Australia, where in traditional Australian lore, every male should have a shed down his garden. It seemed to be idealized as a refuge where a man could smoke, drink beer and have his mates around.

However, the new concept both there and here is a long way from that. Coming to Ireland as a concept in 2008, it came to be seen as a social project which could help men who had recently retired or were widowed or living singly an isolated life. There had been mounting concern not only in rural areas but in cities and towns that there were groups of older men lacking focus in their lives and leaving them isolated and depressed.

The Shed gave them a physical meeting point as well as a chance to enter a society in which everyone was equal. The Shed has become not only a discussion forum, a platform for charitable projects and an educational resource where men can learn new skills and maybe impart their own skills. We have some local examples as well as this local one, in East Wall and in Ballymun. As each Shed represents its members talents there are bound to be different approaches and also of course the facilities available to a group is also an important factor.

#### **CARING IN OUR COMMUNITY**

Marino and its neighbouring parishes have a great reputation as caring communities. Neighbour looks out for neighbour and there is a society around daily mass, and the tea and coffee mornings.

These gatherings alert us to someone who is absent. There may be a very good reason, but they won't think you nosy if you call to check on your friend.

Now that we have been threatened with a very cold spell, perhaps there are things we should think about.

Who has our phone number, and do we have our neighbour's numbers?

Absence from the normal routine could alert us that someone is ill or is housebound, especially if they don't have a carer calling. A phone call may do no harm or a knock on the door.

Other simple things we can do are to make sure we have a clear entry, with no hazards, lest we trip and fall. Perhaps a double check on our outside lights.

Checking our smoke alarms is an important regular task. Carbon Monoxide alarms are essential especially if we have gas or use and open fire. If using a fire regularly having the chimney cleaned is important, probably better to do in the summer. When it is very cold, we tend to close off vents, but these are there for a purpose so do leave plentiful ventilation. Fresh air will help us to stay alert.

There is no need to remind people to eat healthily but if you have been laid up plenty of hot soups will be a pick me up. Don't worry if tin or packet, they will keep you going.

Above all don't be afraid to ask for help if you have no family nearby. Neighbours will come and give you support.

It is part of parish, part of faith, and part of the wider communion of people.

#### THANK YOU, PEOPLE OF MARINO

A BIG thank you from www.thehopefoundation.ie and the street and slum children of Calcutta. The recent Chocolate sale came to  $\in$ 1756, and after Butler's manufacturing costs of  $\in$ 327,  $\in$ 1429 was sent to the charity.

I'm a grandfather in my 70s, and I'm only back after some voluntary work there for the third time and I would like to give you some idea of the charity's work.

The Hope Foundation was set up nineteen years ago by Cork lady called Maureen Forrest.

The Charity now has nine homes for girls and boys, a children's home for children who were either abandoned or in a crisis any age, and a home for mother and child in crisis.

They are all well fed and educated. On reaching the age of eighteen they are legally bound to leave the homes, but the charity ensures they have accommodation and back up support for further education or until they find some work.

Hope have their own little restaurant, where they train up girls as waitresses and cooks. Any profits go to the charity. On the first floor they have a computer room where students are trained and on the same floor, they have a sewing department where they are trained to make clothing for sale. They have their own little shop where some goods are made by the children and are sold at a profit.

One of the biggest surprises for me was to see they have their own small thirty-six bed hospital with a three bed ICU unit with its own operating theatre where ALL OPERATIONS except heart are carried out. It is spread over five floors, where they treat anybody from the streets who are poor and have no money. The hospital was an old building and it was converted by a man called Samron who was the most enthusiastic man I have ever met.

When I was there two and a half ago he was saying he hopes to get the plot next to the hospital and when I was there a few weeks ago he showed me the ground floor of the new building where they hope to get a CT scanning unit which costs €150,000. They have built an eye operating unit which Irish Specsavers have agreed to sponsor for three years and there they will be able to do cataract operations.


The foundation also has opened a Pharmacy next door to the hospital and all profits go to the hospital.

When I went out with the Night watch staff nine years ago they had a small jeep that went out over 300 nights per year to the slum areas to see if anybody needed medical attention, but to my surprise this year they had a fully equipped modern ambulance, with a doctor and nurse on board who see the people and therefore treat them on the streets, (maybe Ireland could do the same).

As I write this, my latest piece for the Parish Newsletter, and my first of 2019, I have just finished my last chemo session, thank God. I would like to express my gratitude to all who prayed for me. I was always conscious of the great wall of prayer that I had behind me from so many great Prayer warriors. This helped me enormously through the rough times. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be said for you all and may you have a happy, holy, and healthy New Year.

The painting I wish to share with you this time is of Paris. It is of a Shop window which I found amusing. I can't remember if they were selling brollies, stockings or what. Simply titled "Shop Window Paris" acrylic on board.

The last time I was in Paris was about seven years ago. We were staying at a small apartment in Montmartre, at the bottom of the hill. There is a large Catholic church around the corner from where we were staying so we decided to get mass there. They have a daily mass at 10.00 o'clock and it is not held in the main body of the church, but in a room at the back. There is generally a small congregation and there are large amounts of tourists walking around the church which would cause a distraction. Although Miriam and I, unfortunately, have no French, and the members of the congregation only had a little English they made us more than welcome. There was a true feeling of fellowship in that little group. We were sad leaving them.

The reason that I have brought up the little community in Paris is that recently when the heating experts were surveying our church, the weekday Mass was held in the Marino Room. I attended Mass there on a Thursday as I was attending the Scripture Study which is held every Thursday at 11. The Mass was lovely and intimate, like the Masses that Miriam and I attended in Paris. Fr. Tom and Fr. Alex were the celebrants. There was a great feeling of fellowship during the Mass and it was capped off by tea /coffee, cake and biscuits, with fellowship, which must have been something like the original breaking of the bread among the early Christians.

I would ask Fr. Tom and the Parish council to please consider, during the coldest and darkest days of the year, to have Weekday Mass in the Marino room, and to follow it with tea / coffee. This would bring our parishioners a greater experience of the breaking of the bread and would also have the financial benefit of cutting down on our heating bill as the main body of the Church would not have to be heated during those days.

I hope everyone is trying something new for the New year, or revisiting something that they loved doing years ago. How about writing something for our News Letter? It doesn't have to be a continuous commitment; it could just be a once off article. 

#### Women's World Day of prayer

The World day of prayer is held annually on the first Friday in March. This year it is on March the 1st. and is being hosted in Slovenia. This day is celebrated here in Ireland also and prayer sessions and lectures on this year's themes are being held generally in our sister Church of Ireland churches.

The theme this year is about welcome and exclusion. It is based on the parable of Jesus, from Luke 14:15-24. It reminds us that people who were invited to the feast cited lots of reasons not to come, so the lord of the house went onto the streets and brought in all who were excluded.

This year then, people are asked to pray about how we welcome people into our lives and what do we do about those who are on the margins. This is always a topic, and always an area where the grace of prayer and charity is needed.

The motif this year is by a Slovenian artist, Rezka Arnuš, depicting a feast prepared by women and then children who were excluded being brought to the table.

## Simply Cooking by

Mary O'Mahony

#### SHEPHERDS PIE

#### **Ingredients:**

11/2 lbs. Lean Mince Beef

2 Medium sized Onions

3 Tablespoons Cooking Oil

1 Teaspoon Flour

150ml Beef Stock (1/4 pt.)

Season with Salt and Pepper

1½ lbs (700a) Potatoes

Pinch grated nutmeg (optional)

1 teaspoon butter (optional)

#### Method:

Break up any lumps in meat with fork.

Skin and slice the onions. Put the oil into saucepan and fry onions until soft but not coloured.

Stir in flour and cook gently for 1 to 2 minutes stirring all the time. Gradually add the stock without letting lumps form and stir until boiling. Reduce heat and simmer for 2 to 3 minutes until sauce thickens. Stir in mince, cover pot and simmer for 20 minutes.

Season well, replace lid and simmer for approximately a further 10 minutes until mince is cooked.

Prepare potatoes and boil them in water (a little salt optional). Mash them with a seasoning of salt, pepper and nutmeg (optional, enough milk to make them creamy), add butter (optional).

Put meat and sauce into a pie dish, cover with potatoes, smooth top then flick it up into small peaks.

Bake for 10 to 15 minutes in hot oven 220°C, 425°F, Gas 7, until nicely browned on top.
