SURPRISED BY...



One of the very popular religious themes in Art at the end of the 16th Century is the depiction of the Supper at Emmaus, where the Risen Christ makes Himself known to the disciples in the breaking of bread. In the painting by Caravaggio, above, we see the astonishment of the disciples as they recognise Him. However, Sister Wendy Beckett, the Art Historian, points out that we are not surprised, since we know that Christ is the one. We also observe that this painting is open towards us. We would have a place there too at the table.

In sharing the surprise and astonishment of the disciples, we should also be surprised, each time we share in the Eucharist, surprised by the gift and by the generosity of Jesus. Each time we encounter Him, He may challenge us more. Sometimes we are the innkeeper, looking on, listening and unaware, or again, the servant expectantly waiting to clear the table and finish up. However, the disciples got up and headed for Jerusalem, knowing that Christ was Risen, to spread the Good news, to share it with the brethren.

In a recent newspaper column, a newly ordained minister in another tradition spoke of coming to understand the Eucharist in the following way. Christ is present in the preparation, in the blessing, in the breaking of bread and above all in the sharing, always present to us who sit at the table.



best job I could on the statue which proved to be more difficult than I had first thought.





EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE



This is the story of a little airl who inspired Archbishop Fulton Sheen to resolve to spend one hour each day before the Blessed Sacrament for the rest of his life. This is a very abbreviated version of a story related by a German priest, Fr Karl Maria Harrer, and published originally in a German book relating to Miracles of the Eucharist. The full story can be obtained on the Internet.

At the start of the Communist regime in China and the persecution of the Catholic Church there, one day a group of soldiers entered an unnamed village, going to the Catholic school there and unceremoniously ordering the school girls to take down all the crucifixes and holy pictures on the school walls which they took away for destruction. (Sounds familiar?)

Some townspeople had gathered, all of whom were ordered by the army captain to go into the Church, where he ridiculed the people's belief in the Real Presence in the Eucharist and that God was present in the Tabernacle. He opened the Tabernacle door, took out the Ciborium and spilled the Hosts on the Church floor, ordering the soldiers to stamp on them. He then triumphantly pronounced that nothing had happened to the soldiers despite their actions.

Before leaving, the soldiers imprisoned the parish priest in a large coal bin in which a small opening allowed him to see the area of the sanctuary and over the course of several days, he saw one young Chinese girl go into the Church, bow and genuflect before reverently placing one of the desecrated Hosts in her mouth, folding her hands and praying for a few minutes. The parish priest lost count of the days in which he was imprisoned but each day this same young girl came into the Church to adore and reverently take one of the hosts to place in her mouth. Eventually, she was discovered by a soldier who shot her on the spot. He was overawed to see her struggle to reach a Host, before falling back dead. Chastened, he released the priest from his prison saying "Sir, if in every town there was such a little girl, no soldier would ever fight for the Communists.' P.M.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, MARINO - PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO KNOCK **Sunday 19th May 2019**



The annual parish pilgrimage to Knock took place on Sunday, 19 May 2019. The bus departed from our parish church promptly at 08:00 and, as always, Lorraine was our able organiser, with the help of a new Catherine this year. After a short stop for tea, coffee and scones in The Grenville Arms in Mullingar, we set off again for Knock in sunshine. Unfortunately, the rain coincided with our arrival at the Marian shrine, but that did not dampen our spirits.

First stop was St. John's Centre, to eat our packed lunches, followed by a browse at the centre's stalls or organising mass cards. The rain stopped in time to allow personal visits around the sights of the shrine - the Apparition Chapel, the parish church, the Chapel of Reconciliation, Blessed Sacrament Chapel - or maybe the museum or the shrine shops.

At 14:30, the ceremony of the anointing of the sick took place in the Basilica, followed by mass at 15:00. Mass was concelebrated by Bishop Brendan Kelly of Galway, Bishop John Kirby of Clonfert, Fr. Dermot Meehan, Administrator of Achonry, and assisted by Deacon Kevin Flynn of the Diocese of Achonry. Bishop Kirby's sermon was on the theme "the family that prays together, stays together" and drew on Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, "The Joy of Love". Acknowledging that family prayer together has declined in Irish homes, Bishop Kirby suggested a 'take five' approach to help reintroduce family prayer time. Take 1 minute together in the morning to ask the Lord's blessing on the day to come. Take 1 minute together for the Angelus. Take 2 minutes together for one decade of the rosary, reflecting on one of the incidents from the life of Mary or Jesus. Finally, take 1 minute together at the end of the day to thank God for what went well and to express our sorrow for any faults or sins we may have committed. Five minutes may be a small amount of time but it would have a significant effect on bringing Christ into our families' lives. Bishop Kirby also linked the decline in family prayer together, along with the increasing secularisation of society, to the decline in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. As he said, a flower won't grow unless seeds are planted.

After mass, the weather was dry enough to allow the rosary procession to proceed outdoors. Thanks to Helen for carrying our Marino banner. After the rosary procession, it was straight back to the bus for the trip home. After a stop at the Percy French Hotel in Strokestown, for dinner and the obligatory group photograph, it was back on the road. With the rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet finished, it was time for the annual bus guiz (thanks Catherine and Lorraine) and a lovely reminiscence piece from Mary Shiels. We are already looking forward to our 2020 trip. Thanks again to Lorraine and Catherine.

Simply Cooking with

Mary O'Mahony

COFFEE CAKE

Ingredients:

For the sponge

50 grams walnut pieces

225 grams caster sugar

225 grams soft unsalted butter (plus some for greasing)

200 grams self raising flour

4 teaspoons instant coffee powder

10 grams baking powder

4 grams bicarbonate of soda

4 large eggs

100 ml milk

For the butter cream topping

350 grams icing sugar

175 grams soft unsalted butter

2 % teaspoons instant coffee powder (dissolved in 1 tablespoon boiling water)

Walnut halves (to decorate)

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C

Grease two 20 cm sandwich tins and line the base of each with greaseproof paper.

Put the walnut pieces and sugar into a food processor and blitz to a fine nutty powder.

Add the butter, flour, coffee powder, baking powder, bicarb and eggs and process to a smooth batter.

Then add the milk. pouring it down the funnel with the motor still running or just pulsing to loosen the cake mixture: It should be a soft, dropping consistency, so add more milk if you need to.

Divide the mixture between the 2 lined tins and bake in the oven for 35 minutes, or until the sponge has risen and feels springy to the touch

Cool the cakes in their tins on a wire rack for about 10 minutes. before turning them out onto the rack and peeling off the greaseproof paper.

When the sponges are cool you can make the butter cream.

Pulse the icing sugar in the food processor until it is lump free, then add the butter and process to make a smooth icing.

Dissolve the instant coffee powder in 1 tablespoon boiling water and add it while still hot into the processor, pulsing to blend into the buttercream.

Place one sponge on a base or large plate. Spread some of the buttercream on top. Place second sponge on top and spread remainder of buttercream on top and sides of cake. Decorate with walnut halves

NEW BISHOP OF CORK AND ROSS



On the 30th of June last the parishioners of Marino shared in a joyful celebration with the people of the Diocese of Cork and Ross when Father Fintan Gavin, a native of Marino, was installed as the new Bishop of Cork and Ross. In a moving ceremony at the Cathedral of St. Mary and St. Anne, attended by almost 1000 people, the formal

installation took place with the various members of the hierarchy present including the Archbishops of Dublin, Armagh and Cashel and Emly, along with the Church of Ireland Bishop of Cork and representatives from other faiths. Also, of course, Fr. Fintan had members of his family present along with parishioners and clergy from Marino

In the homily at the Mass, he was warmly welcomed, and the homily concentrated not only on the readings but on the duty of all to follow, to heal and to search for the poor and broken.

In his own address, the new Bishop spoke warmly of the welcome he had received and of his predecessor Bishop Buckley whose wise and compassionate presence over more than twenty years had left a legacy of warm and Christian fellowship throughout the Diocese. Bishop Gavin hoped that he would continue this legacy, recognising all the good that was there already. He hoped that his tenure would allow him to work towards healing, to reach out to those hurt and broken by the past, and especially the young in whom he had so much trust.

He reminded the congregation that Pope Francis had called the young people, "the Now of God" in our midst. Without nurturing them we will fail to keep God at the centre of our lives. Quoting the renowned Cork religious, Venerable Nano Nagle, "love one another as you have hitherto done' and also 'love the poor' he felt that this is where God wants us to be. He also reminded all of us that "We recognise Jesus in his Word, in the Eucharist and each of the Sacraments, in each other, and in our own hearts"

Our continued prayers will be with him as he sets out to shepherd his flock on that journey to our Eternal Father-truly a journey for souls and with souls.
