
This week's preparation for First Communion

As you might remember, a lot of Sundays recently have been special Feast Days – Ascension Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi. This Sunday is just called 'The 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time'. If you pray along with Mass this Sunday, you will see that the priest is wearing green! This is not, as you might think, in honour of



Ireland or St Patrick but because what the church calls 'ordinary' time is also called the 'great, green, growing Sundays'. There are lots of these during the year.

Here is the Circle of the Church Year. Can you see which 'great, green, growing' time we are in at the moment?

To do this week:

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Don't be afraid of anyone!
