How beautiful he is, how merry, robust and strong!

All praise be yours My Lord for Sister Earth our mother, who feeds us, rules us and brings forth all manner of fruit, all coloured flowers and herbs.

Interesting fact about St Francis:

St Francis was the first person to make a Christmas crib. He made it in Greccio in Italy on Christmas night nearly 800 years ago with a real ox and a real donkey and a statue of the baby Jesus in a manger.
