On Monday, November 2nd 2020 at 7.30 p.m., the Feast of All Souls, a Special Mass will be celebrated and streamed live via our webcam at www.marinoparish.ie/live-stream/ This Mass is being offered for the repose of the souls of our Parishioners who died during the past twelve months (1st October 2019 to 30th September 2020) and for the special intentions of their families and friends and for all our deceased loved ones.
